This exciting role requires the successful candidate(s) to develop and provide a holistic learning environment that includes designing, updating, delivering and evaluating curriculum in a variety of areas in the Indigenous Wellness and Addictions program. These areas include but are not limited to: Traditional healing, learning and teaching, Cultural specific helping, Challenges facing Indigenous communities, Interviewing, reporting and documenting, Addictions counselling skills, Relapse preventions, Multiculturalism, Psychology and sociology.
