Responsibilities:

Working under the direction of the SN Polytechnic-STEAM Academy Principal, the duties of this position will include, but are not limited to the following:

- Instruct using a variety of teaching and learning strategies, in one or more subjects.
- Communicate clear objectives/goals and success criteria for lessons, units, and projects.
- Use strategies under triangulation of data (student observations, conversations and products) to evaluate student progress.
- Administer and grade tests/assignments.
- Be able to prepare materials and classrooms for class activities.
- Differentiate teaching methods, materials and assessments to meet the varying needs and interests of students.
- Maintain accurate and complete student records as required by law and administrative regulations.
- Supervision for the safety of all students.
- Use technology, hands-on activities and knowledge of Hodinohsó:ni' history, culture, values, contemporary issues, community priorities and stakeholders to enrich curriculum and instruction.
- Perform other duties as assigned by the Principal.
- Use progressive discipline strategies in the classroom, including conferences with families, teachers, counselors, and administrators to resolve students' behavioral and academic issues.
